Rocking 3S Ranch SKIT: LESSON ONE

[Background music appropriate for skit. Personally I have used the movie theme from *The Magnificent Seven* and *Zorro* and others. I like the mood it sets for the entrance of the "Super Hero"; you may prefer something less dramatic.]

Enter Super Cowboy! [Have four people carry Super Cowboy on their shoulders. He will be in a horizontal position dressed as Super Cowboy which includes a sheet/cape of some fashion. They are "flying" him into the room.]

Conversation with Super Cowboy: [If you plan on a series of lessons then conversation should include Super Cowboy coming each week. This will build your class numbers and enable you to reach more boys and girls with the messages/lessons.]

Teacher: Good Morning, Super Cowboy!

Super Cowboy: Well, Good Morning, Little Lady [or insert name of teacher here.]

Teacher: What brings you to [insert name of your church/class] this morning?

Super Cowboy: I heard you were telling the boys and girls about a Super Hero today so I wanted to be here IN PERSON to explain ALL about myself.....me...that'd be me....Super Cowboy...emphasis on Super. Haha

Teacher: Well,....Suuuppppeerrrr...Cowboy. This lesson today comes from the Bible, God's Holy Word. It's about a REAL person that lived a good while back.

Super Cowboy: I am a REAL person and I am alive. See you can pinch me right here on my arm. Go ahead pinch me.

Teacher: No, I don't think I want to pinch you. [Shakes head].

Super Cowboy: Yeah, sure, go ahead pinch me right here on my arm. It won't hurt. I am a SUPER HERO SUPER COWBOY....[braggingly said].

Teacher: Well, if you are sure it won't hurt.

Super Cowboy: No, won't hurt me at all.....

Teacher: [Reaches to pinch and Cowboy goes into a OH THAT HURT SO MUCH fit.] But I haven't touched you yet!

Super Cowboy: haha..yeah...I knew that...I was just testing you.

Teacher: Suuuuppper Cowboy, I am afraid you don't meet the qualifications for the Super Hero we are talking about today. You see, his name is Abraham and he was a real Hero and Champion. He didn't even need to wear a costume.

Super Cowboy: NO COSTUME!

Teacher: No Costume.

Super Cowboy: [Whispers] Wasn't that kinda embarrassing and COLD in the winter?

Teacher: Super Cowboy, I think you need to go to your class and learn about today's super hero, Abraham.

Super Cowboy: Yep, sounds like an interesting feller all right....No costume you say?!

[Music up and four assistants put Super Cowboy up on their shoulders and they exit out the back to waves, accolades and fanfare.]

Rocking 3S Ranch SKIT: LESSON TWO

[Background music]

Enter Super Cowboy! [Have four people carry Super Cowboy on their shoulders. He will be in a horizontal position dressed as Super Cowboy which includes a sheet/cape of some fashion. They are "flying" him into the room.]

Teacher: Good Morning, Super Cowboy!

Super Cowboy: Well, Good Morning, Little Lady [or insert name of teacher here.]

Teacher: We were certainly happy that you were here last week. What brings you by this morning?

Super Cowboy: I heard you were telling the boys and girls about a Super Hero today so I wanted to be here IN PERSON to explain ALL about myself.....me...that'd be me....Super Cowboy...emphasis on Super. Haha

Super Cowboy: [Whispers] He must have been a fast runner to rope a calf in record time without a horse.

Teacher: Super Cowboy, he didn't even have a rope..that is, except for the one he got tied up in.

Super Cowboy: Yep, sounds like an interesting feller all right....No horse, you say?! No rope? I think I'd like to meet this fellow.

Teacher: Can't today.

Super Cowboy: Why not?

Teacher: He's dead. That is, he's in Heaven already.

Super Cowboy: Well, I can certainly see how that could happen; running after a calf on foot with no rope and all. Yes, indeed, Super Champion you say? Well, I'd like to stay around and learn more about this dead Champion, but I have places to be; people to impress!

[Music up and four assistants put Super Cowboy up on their shoulders and they exit out the back to waves, accolades and fanfare.]

Rocking 3S Ranch SKIT: LESSON THREE

[Background music]

Enter Super Cowboy! [Have four people carry Super Cowboy on their shoulders. He will be in a horizontal position dressed as Super Cowboy which includes a sheet/cape of some fashion. They are "flying" him into the room.]

Teacher: Good Morning, Super Cowboy!

Super Cowboy: Well, Good Morning, Little Lady [or insert name of teacher here.]

Teacher: We were certainly happy that you were here last week. What brings you by this morning?

Super Cowboy: I heard you were telling the boys and girls about a rather "unique" super hero today..haha..Heard this one "talks in his sleep"...yes, yes, I did hear that..haha.

Teacher: Well, Super Cowboy. This lesson today comes from the Bible, God's Holy Word. It's about a REAL person that lived a good while back. Today it's about Samuel.

Super Cowboy: Samuel, Samuel, as I recall, Didn't he have "SLEEP **NAP**-nea" or something like that? Had trouble sleeping as I recall.

Teacher: Actually, he was sleeping just fine before **THE VOICE** woke him up.

Super Cowboy: Voice? He heard a voice? Sounds like he'd been out in the prairie sun just a little too long to me.

Teacher: He heard GOD call his name.

Super Cowboy: Mercy! Did he have a horse kick him in the head?

Teacher: No, nothing like that, Super Cowboy.

Super Cowboy: Sounds like an interesting fellow indeed!

[Music up and four assistants put Super Cowboy up on their shoulders and they exit out the back to waves, accolades and fanfare.]

Rocking 3S Ranch SKIT: LESSON FOUR

[Background music]

Enter Super Cowboy! [Have four people carry Super Cowboy on their shoulders. He will be in a horizontal position dressed as Super Cowboy which includes a sheet/cape of some fashion. They are “flying” him into the room.]

Teacher: Good Morning, Super Cowboy!

Super Cowboy: Well, Good Morning, Little Lady [or insert name of teacher here.]

Teacher: We were certainly happy that you are here again this week. What brings you by this morning?

Super Cowboy: Samson, yes, Samson brings me by this morning. Would NOT want to miss this lesson! No sir-ree, would not want to miss this one!

Teacher: Yes, today’s lesson is on Samson and he was a very strong man, the Bible tells us.

Rocking 3S Ranch SKIT: LESSON FIVE

[Background music]

Enter Super Cowboy! [Have four people carry Super Cowboy on their shoulders. He will be in a horizontal position dressed as Super Cowboy which includes a sheet/cape of some fashion. They are “flying” him into the room.] He is carrying a fire extinguisher.

Teacher: Good Morning, Super Cowboy!

Super Cowboy: I am here to SAVE THE DAY as ALL good Superheroes should be doing!

Teacher: We were certainly happy that you are here again this week. What are you doing with a fire extinguisher this morning?

Super Cowboy: I came to put out the fire!

Teacher: What fire?

Super Cowboy: Well, the very HOT fire! You know the one in the lesson today, where the three cowboys let the campfire get out of control!

Teacher: Oh no, Super Cowboy, it was bigger than a campfire! It was a big furnace and hot enough to cook the cowboys.

Super Cowboy: You don't say?!

Teacher: Ahhhhhh
